





Standing Zipperbag with lining


Cut your fabric. Cut the top of fabric A & B at the size of zipper + 2 cm longer. Cut the bottom of the fabric wider \rightarrow , you can play with it, start with a length \pm 10 cm wider.




Sorry, it will look like this of course;




Put a pin 4 cm of all corners

g^B

Align of each corner the side and the bottom seam so the pins on each side of a corner will touch each other.



if you look from here it looks like this:
like your bags has small flaps on all sides.



g^C

stitch these triangle corners 4 cm from the pointy end (where you placed the pin) \rightarrow

⑩ Cut of the triangle corners $1/2$ cm from your stitch line. Trim all edges $1/2$ cm from stitch lines.

Don't trim the fabric where the whole is in B.
